#### Northfield RSL and Helping Hand At Ingle Farm



### Walkley Heights

Recently Trish was contacted by a constituent from Walkley Heights requesting a sealed footpath, kerbing and guttering to be constructed adjacent the carpark on Walkley's Road. In turn, Trish contacted the Salisbury Council for help and was delighted that the Salisbury Council allocated funds for a paving block footpath to be constructed along Walkley's Road, from Stockman Place to the Dry Creek Linear Conservation Park, and also included construction of footpaths to Jackaroo Crescent, Saddle Crescent and Polo Court. Thanks to Peter and his concerns for the community, this issue was highlighted and has now been solved.

### Tough On Drugs Strategy

Many Makin constituents would be aware of the Coalition Government's Tough on Drug Strategy. The Government will be building on the success of this strategy during its next term of office and has committed a further \$109 million for drug rehabilitation, law enforcement and community education. The National Heroin Signature Program (an important intelligence program for police) will be expanded to include cocaine and amphetamines. This will result in more targeted operations against the trafficking of these substances. As well as law enforcement measures, other initiatives include:

- \$61.6 million extra funding over four years for Non-Government Treatment Program for community based treatment and rehabilitation
- \$12 million extra funding over 4 years for Community Partnership Initiative
- \$27.5 million for the development and introduction of retractable needle technology; and
- \$1 million over 4 years to continue the alcohol and drug free message delivered in remote communities.
   The initiatives which have been introduced will continue the fight against drugs on the fronts of education, health and law enforcement.
